REPORT OF THE ITTO FELLOWSHIP SELECTION PANEL

1. The Fellowship Selection Panel evaluated fellowship applications submitted in time and selected successful candidates for the Spring 2009 awards. The Selection Panel was composed of:

2. The Selection Panel considered a total of 101 applications made up of 75 applications from producer countries and 26 applications from consumer countries. Ten percent of the applications were in the field of Economic Information and Market Intelligence (EIMI); 84% in the field of Reforestation and Forest Management (RFM); and 6% in the field of Forest Industry (FI). Thirty-four percent of the applications were submitted by female applicants.

While reviewing these 101 applications, the Panel used the following selection criteria:

- (i) Consistency of the proposed activities with the ITTO fellowship programme's objective and priority areas;
- (ii) Qualifications of the applicants to undertake the proposed fellowship activities;
- (iii) Applications and benefits of the skills and knowledge to be acquired or advanced under the fellowship activities; and
- (iv) Reasonableness of costs in relation to the proposed activities.
- 3. The Panel took into account the balance among the three subject areas and regions as well as the opportunity to promote the participation of women. The Panel recommends that 23 applications should be approved, subject to the availability of funds at a total cost of US\$149,575. Eighty-three percent of

the recommended applications were in the field of RFM; 3% in the field of EIMI; and 4% in the field of FI. Women account for 30% of the recommended applications. Seventy-eight percent of the recommended applications were from producer countries and 22% from Developing Consumers countries. The recommended applications are listed in the Appendix to this report.
