





Difference/gap between on-going activities & REDD

e.g.

- National policy setting for REDD
- Reference scenario / emission reference level
- Reducing emission activities
- Monitoring requirement & measurement
- Policy approach & positive incentive

Japan's initiatives (1)

- Announcement of contribution to Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF) launched by WB, Oct. 2007
 - finance 10 million USD to FCPF
- Emergency call for tackling deforestation at COP13, Bali, Dec.2007
 - Use the latest satellite information to monitor deforestation & degradation
 - Organize national workshop for sharing information & elaborating pilot activities
 - Consolidate possible actions among stakeholders
- Project agreement on forest resources monitoring using latest satellite technology in Indonesia, Feb. 2008
 - Apply Japan's PALSAR technology (JAXA) to upgrade forest resource monitoring & assessment system
 - Further develop carbon accounting by remote sensing

Japan's initiatives (2)

- "Forest fire as an element of REDD" seminar in Indonesia, Mar.2008
 - Share views among stakeholders on fire, bio-energy & mining pressures
- "Japan-Asia REDD seminar" for capacity building, Mar. 2008
 - Familiarize selected Asian countries with REDD for the participation
 - Share a variety of information
- "2nd GEOSS Asia-Pacific Symposium" for earth observation, April 2008
 - Propose coordination to realize global forest carbon observation
- Hosting SBSTA 3rd REDD workshop in Tokyo, June 2008
 - Discuss methodological issues under UNFCCC
- TICADIV in Yokohama, May 2008
- G8 Toyako Summit, July 2008

Through International Expert Meeting, we expect to;

- Share a variety of information & methodologies
- Share lessons from advanced efforts in SFM
- Build capacity to plan & implement REDD
- Explore the possibility of additional efforts, including "demonstration activities" encouraged at COP13, and
- Clarify further issues to be solved & the next steps.
