

International Expert Meeting on Addressing Climate Change through Sustainable Management of Tropical Forests

Closing remarks by Emmanuel Ze Meka Executive Director of the International Tropical Timber Organization (ITTO) Madam Katharina Kümayer, Chairperson of the International Tropical Timber Council,
