Background and objectives

The International Tropical Timber Organization (ITTO) and the International Union of Forest Research Organizations (IUFRO) have been collaborating on the conservation and sustainable use of tropical forests in developing countries, through the dissemination and utilization of scientific information regarding the results/findings of research on tropical forests. Over the past years, ITTO and IUFRO have joined their efforts to support the Global Forest Information Service (GFIS) and to expand it in ITTO member countries, mainly in Africa.

Besides strengthening the capacity of forest research institutions, in developing countries, in effectively disseminating forest-related information, it is also important to promote the creation of new scientific knowledge through networking and closer cooperation among forest scientists and institutions. Towards this end, ITTO and IUFRO are working with the Forestry Research Network for Sub-Saharan Africa (FORNESSA) for the dissemination of scientific information for enhancing the interactions between the forest science community and various forest stakeholders (policy makers, forest communities, forest managers, etc.).

In September 2007, the two organizations signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) in order formalize their cooperation on tropical forest-related issues in developing countries. The Twenty-fourth IUFRO World Congress, to be convened in Salt Lake City, USA, on 5-11 October 2014 will provide a good opportunity for ITTO and IUFRO to demonstrate their efforts of cooperation by jointly holding of a side event titled: "Tropical forests, connecting the world through sustainability", which intends to mainly achieve the following goals:

 to strengthen the relations and facilitate further collaboration and joint activities between ITTO and IUFRO under the MoU signed by both Organizations; and

• to share, through interactive panel discussion, experiences and lessons learned from the field activities which ITTO and IUFRO have implemented to promote the sustainable management of tropical forests in member countries.
