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## ITTO Draft Biennial Work Programme, BWP 2018-2019

- Decision 9(XXXIV) requests the ED to develop a BWP which prioritizes and allocates resources for specific activities under the Organization's Action Plan
- The draft BWP 2018-2019 is taking into account the ITTA 2006, the SAP 2013-2018, the progress report on the BWP 2015-2016 extended into 2017 and inputs from member countries, TAG and CSAG.

# New Structure Draft BWP 2018-2019

With a view to provide a *more coherent structure* to the activities under the BWP, the proposed activities have been categorized according to their nature, with *five categories*:

- Group 1: Field Oriented Activities with Engagement of/Work In Member Countries;
- Group 2: Normative Work on Policy Guidelines or Other Strategic Work;
- Group 3: Collaborative Work with Other Organizations/Initiatives Including Meetings;
- Group 4: Communications and Outreach Related Work;
- Group 5: Analytical, Statistical and Other Recurring Work

In addition the BWP includes *Financial and Administrative Activities* having no financial requirements



To link the BWP to relevant overarching goals of ITTO and the global community, each activity in Groups 1-5 contains a reference to:

•The Strategic Priority(ies) of the SAP 2013-2018 it would contribute to;

•The Global Forest Goals (*and thus which sustainable development goals*) it would contribute to under the UN Strategic Plan on Forests 2017-2030, UNSPF. *A reference table is provided with descriptions of the strategic priorities (SPs) and global forest goals (GFGs);* 

As before the Annex to the draft BWP contains the Terms of Reference for the proposed activities that require financing.

GFG 3	Increase significantly the area of protected forests worldwide and other areas of sustainably managed forests, as well as the proportion of forest products from sustainably managed forests
GFG 4	Mobilize significantly increased, new and additional financial resources from all sources for the implementation of sustainable forest management and strengthen scientific, technical and technological cooperation and partnerships
GFG 5	Promote sustainable governance frameworks to implement sustainable forest management, including through the United Nations forest instrument, and enhance the contribution of forests to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development
GFG 6	Enhance cooperation, coordination, coherence and synergies on forest-related issues at all levels, including within the United Nations system and across CPF member organizations, as well as across sectors and relevant stakeholders
