

Principles of ITTO Forest Industry

Main Objectives

- Enhance SFM
- Contribute to socio-economic develop.
- Facilitate poverty alleviation and community develop.

Major Focus

- Efficient use of resources
- Value adding processing
- Small scale, community-based enterprises
- From legal/sustainably sources



Efforts of ITTO Forestry Industry

Since 1987:

- 180 projects and pre-projects have been implemented.
- Valued at US\$91 million.

Currently:

- 28 projects, 3 pre-projects and 2 activities are being carried out,
- In 23 countries.



Application of Intermediate Technologies for Sustainable Forest Harvesting

Peru

To strengthen forest industry by providing:

• Training for the use of <u>intermediate technologies</u> for harvesting

• <u>Financial mechanism</u> for the acquisition of the technologies

• Business and managerial assistance






Development and Delivery of a Vocational Training Programme in Reduced Impact Logging

Guyana

- More than 300 people were trained, including loggers, forest administrators and community members.
- Training covered all aspects of forest operation, including planning, road construction, tree marking, skidding and operational safety.





Establishment of a Wood Workers and Craftsmanship Village

Ghana

- Relocation of 60 small wood processing mills and furniture producers from metropolitan area.
- Establishment of common facilities such as kiln dryer, saw doctoring shop, and moulding, laminating and finishing units.







Improvement of Sustainable Management and Utilization of Non-Timber Forest Products

Cambodia

To improve local livelihood by achieving a sustainable management of non timber forest resources, in its social, economic and legal aspects.

Challenges

- Small percentage of standing volume of tropical timber is processed into final products.
- More than 80% of tropical forests is production forests.

- Planted forests are rapidly increasing.
