IYF and ITTO's 25th Anniversary in 2011

[Decision 3(XLVI)]

[Item 17 of the Provisional Agenda]

This document provides information for Council members on activities of the Organization related to the International Year of Forests (IYF) and ITTO's 25th Anniversary during 2011, as provided for by ITTC Decision 3(XLVI).

ITTO carried out numerous activities during 2011 up to the time of preparing this report to commemorate its 25th anniversary during the IYF, with several other activities planned for the last quarter of the year. The table below summarizes progress in implementing the activities contained in the indicative list annexed to Decision 3(XLVI), followed by additional activities undertaken or planned during the year.

In addition to the above, the Secretariat also participated in CPF meetings in 2011 during which CPF partners reported on their respective IYF-related activities and planned a series of CPF-endorsed press releases during the year. The Secretariat has provided comments and input to several of these CPF press releases and is responsible with FAO for the November CPF press release on markets and trade in forest products. All CPF IYF press releases have been posted on the ITTO website.

ITTO's website has prominently displayed the IYF logo during the year, together with a banner noting ITTO's 25th year. The UNFF IYF website is linked to ITTO's site, and a special section for IYF events (including non-ITTO events) added.

ITTO and its 25th anniversary were prominently featured in several Japanese newspapers during 2011, including Kanagawa Shimbun, Asahi Shimbun, etc. The Organization sponsored a poster contest for local school children focusing on Japan's links with tropical forests (including ITTO and its 25th anniversary) during 2011, with prizes for the best posters to be awarded in October at International Festa, a weekend festival organized by the City of Yokohama. ITTO also contributed chapters to *The Ecosystem Promise* (to be published by the Dutch author of *Amazon Your Business* by the end of 2011) and *Forests for People* (a commemorative book commissioned by UNFF for the closing of the IYF). ITTO also collaborated with FAO to produce the background paper for the 3 Rainforest Basins Summit in June, which summarized the state of forests and forest management in the countries participating in the Summit.

Members are invited to share information on their activities already undertaken and plans for additional activities during the IYF under this agenda item. Members are encouraged to liaise with the Secretariat if ITTO participation is desired in national activities throughout the remainder of the year.
