

#### **EXPERT GROUP MEETING**

## Unlocking the wealth of forests for community development

Commercializing products from community forests

FAO, Rome – Italy 26<sup>th</sup> - 28<sup>th</sup> March 2012.

#### BACKGROUND

Community forestry has the potential to deliver significant economic benefits for local communities. This however, requires that it moves beyond providing mainly subsistence goods, to becoming a vehicle for the development of forest enterprises which can contribute to a genuine new forest economy. A lot of effort has been devoted by countries to implementing the initial stages of community forestry processes, including formal recognition of rights to access, management and strengthening of local level institutions. There are significant challenges now faced by countries, in moving community forestry to full commercialization. There is urgent need to remove regulatory bottlenecks and strengthen community institutions to negotiate and tap into profitable markets.

FAO and its partners, ITTO and RECOFTC are interested in pursuing an international initiative to promote the potential of community forests in contributing significantly to sustainable development of community forestry and thus to wider national development. The Expert group meeting is therefore an opportunity to further concretize and develop a course of action.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

The goal of the meeting is to develop concrete strategies for an international agenda to promote commercialization of products from community forests in order to contribute to community and national economic development efforts.

Specific objectives:

- 1. Present and exchange views on key issues and suggestions outlined in the background paper;
- 2. Identify priority areas of action to promote effective commercialization of products from Community forestry;
- 3. Determine the scope (geographical, policy field interface, etc), key actors, collaborators and potential partnerships; approaches (projects, etc) and modalities for resource mobilization;
- Discuss appropriate organizational/institutional mechanisms for oversight, coordination, implementation, funding, and communication among the lead partners (FAO, ITTO RECOFTC) and with other collaborators.

### EXPECTED OUTPUTS

- A proposed roadmap for taking forward the initiative, including priority areas of work, timeframes and geographical scope
- Proposals for partnership actions, project development
- A proposed framework of operation including mechanisms for coordination and implementation, roles and expectations of the partners and collaborators

## Participants:

15-20 experts drawn from governmental institutions, implementing organizations, private sector, UN agencies and other international/or national organizations that have practical experience on the topic and who can substantially contribute to the discussion in a conceptual and strategic way. FAO will be able to support about 10 participants, mainly from developing countries.

### Venue:

The meeting is proposed to be held at FAO in Rome.

### Language:

The meeting will be conducted in English.
