REDD+ within INDCs: Governance lessons learnt from community forest management in tropics

Date and Time: Tuesday, 01 Dec 2015, 16:45—18:15

Venue: Observer Room 04, official Conference venue (Paris-Le Bourget site)

REDD+ finds a prominent place in the Intended Nationally Determined Contributions (INDCs) of many tropical countries, with GHG reduction targets between 15% and 50% relative to a business as usual scenario by 2030. Several countries have mentioned forestry as a key sector for achieving their intended emission reduction and sink enhancement targets with some also specifying specific forest-related activities comprised in these targets. Because of its vast and varied landscape and high community dependence, the Indonesian forests provide an ideal setting for enhancing our understanding of what lies ahead. This side event will provide an opportunity to discuss issues of REDD+ in Indonesia's INDCs taking a significant step to reduce emissions from Land Use, Land-use Change and Forestry (LULUCF). Lessons learned from community forest management in Myanmar and elsewhere in the tropics as a growing model for collaborative decision-making and development will also be discussed to explore common principles for forest governance and social-environmental safeguards in designing and implementing effective forest-based climate change mitigation and adaptation measures.
