Bilateral and regional free-trade agreements (FTAs) have proliferated in recent years as efforts to secure a global deal on trade liberalisation through the WTO have stalled.

But are exporters using them? If not, why not? What benefits do they provide? And what are the downsides?

A recent analysis by HSBC Global Connections has looked closely at utilisation of FTAs in ASEAN where exporters have no lack of options in their approach to free trade agreements because their governments have ensured them choices.

HSBC says "The choices may be rich, but utilisation is surprisingly low with each FTA signed in ASEAN used, on average, by only one in four exporters". Is this a pattern repeated in any of ITTOs producer member countries?
