Areas along international borders are often characterized by rich forests and forest biodiversity. Ecological systems and wildlife habitats stretch beyond boundaries and local and indigenous communities share origin and culture across borders.

Since the 1990s, ITTO has supported its producer member countries in establishing and managing transboundary conservation areas. BirdLife International has also worked with its partner organizations to conserve tropical forest biodiversity in transboundary areas through the implementation of Forests of Hope Programme.

This side event will showcase transboundary conservation projects implemented under a ITTO-CBD Collaborative Initiative for Tropical Forest Biodiversity and the BirdLife International Forests of Hope Programme.
