REDD+ Implementation

- Building on on-going short and long term policies
 - Maintain at least 50% of land mass as forest
 - Managing forest for its commodity to natural capital
 - Central Forest Spine and Heart of Borneo
- Building on existing systems
 - Sustainable forest management principles
 - Forest monitoring system
 - Land is under the jurisdiction of sub national government
- Cost effective measures
- REDD+ initiatives have only national funds

REDD+ RBP Scope in Malaysia

- Sustainable Management of Forest
 - · PRF where commercial harvest is undertaken
 - New areas subjected to sustainable forest management through the gazettement as PRF
 - Extended harvesting rotation cycle.
 - Designation of forest for conservation
- Why?
 - 10th Malaysian Plan : *Valuing Our Environmental Endowments*, enhancing forest management
 - towards a low-carbon economy and SD
 - Conservation of forest
