- Increase conservation and sustainable use of mangrove resources for livelihood benefits of local populations and for increased economic and environmental resilience
- Increase mangrove contributions to SDGs and climate change mitigation and adaptation

#### **Seven Thematic Areas**

- 4: Restoration of degraded mangrove forests and ecosystems (Restoration)
- 5: Strengthening good governance, law enforcement and monitoring systems (Governance)
- 6: Scaling up payments for environmental services in mangrove forests (PES)
- 7: Increasing research, education and awareness (Research & Education)

# **Conference Process (1)**
