


## Activity 3 – Strengthening participation of the private sector in the work of ITTO:

- •IMM Annual Report 2017 was presented to the EU Commission in July 2018 and is expected to be published on the IMM website soon.
- •Survey work has continued through 2018
- •A special study of the EU furniture sector was completed in June 2018 and the scoping study has been published in ITTO's Technical Series *TS47 A Tabling of View*
