MOTIVATION AND OBJECTIVES Revenue Paper

> Governments (and therefore citizens) only collect a fraction of the forestry revenues to which they are entitled either by law or in principle

Revenues that are collected are often lost to corruption or mismanagement



MOTIVATION AND OBJECTIVES Motivation and Objectives: Revenue Paper

This project aims to:

Assess what is known about sound management of commercial forestry concessions, through the lens of revenue generation and administration

Examine the entry points for reform of policies and processes



MOTIVATION AND OBJECTIVES **Revenue** Paper

> Paper will also generate preliminary conclusions/recommendations regarding World Bank operations, knowledge gaps, and next steps

Primary audience: client governments, WB operational teams, and others working on forestry revenue management
