Regional Workshop on Enhancing the Conservation and Sustainable Management of Teak Forests and Legal and Sustainable Wood Supply Chains in the Greater Mekong Subregion

24–27 September 2019, Yangon, Myanmar

Background:

With its outstanding physical and aesthetic qualities, teak (*Tectona grandis*) is recognized as one of the world's most important and valuable hardwoods. It has been used for centuries in a wide range of products, including furniture and housing construction, and is also highly valued for its cultural roles. Natural teak forests cover about 29 million hectares in central and southern India, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Myanmar and Thailand. There is an ongoing loss of natural teak forest in all native teak-growing countries, however, due mainly to overharvesting, agricultural expansion and shifting cultivation. In particular, there has been a significant decline in high-quality old-growth teak stands, and there is a high risk that valuable genetic diversity is being lost.

ITTO conducted an activity titled Enhancing Teak Management with the aim of improving the management and marketing of natural and planted teak in the three tropical regions. With support from Germany through the Federal Ministry of Food and Agriculture, ITTO is now implementing the Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS) Teak Project encompassing five countries—Cambodia, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Myanmar, Thailand and Viet Nam.

The aim of the GMS Teak Project is to enhance natural teak forest management, production and marketing through the establishment of legal and sustainable wood supply chains and thereby to improve local economies and the livelihoods of local communities. The project is expected to generate three outputs: 1) enhanced conservation of teak genetic resources, the sustainable management and use of natural teak forests, and market access of teak from legal sources; 2) the strengthening of community-based and smallholder teak forest management and agroforestry systems; and 3) increased regional and international collaboration, information sharing and knowledge management, and networking.

The first regional workshop on sustainable teak management is being organized by ITTO, the Forest Research Institute of Myanmar and the Asian Forest Cooperation Organization (AFoCO) in collaboration with Cambodia's Forestry Administration (FA), the Lao People's Democratic Republic's National Agriculture and Forestry Research Institute (NAFRI),

Thailand's Royal Forest Department (RFD) and Kasetsart University (KU), and the Vietnamese Academy of Forest Sciences (VAFS).

Objectives:

The overall goal of this workshop is to explore the planning and implementation of research and development activities for sustainable teak forest management. Specifically, it will:

- I. Review the status of conservation of teak genetic resources, natural teak forest management and sustainable teak plantations in the GMS.
- II. Review policy and institutional arrangements for legal and sustainable supply chains and investment in teak forests.
- III. Review and share experiences on case studies, good practices and policy options for empowering local communities and smallholders in planted teak and teak management, and agroforestry systems to support sustainable livelihoods.

A field excursion to teak forests in Myanmar will be organized.

The outputs of the first regional workshop will be shared among the five participating countries, with interested individuals and organizations, and at the 4th World Teak Congress, to be held in Ghana in 2020. The TEAKNET Bulletin and the project's Facebook page will also be used to disseminate outcomes.
