1.9 Proposal Summary	Cameroon is the second-largest forest country in the Congo Basin with coverage of approximately 22.5 million hectares as defined in the national REDD+ strategy. However, the FAO reports deforestation and degradation of these forests at a rate of 20,000 ha per year. These forests are deteriorating dramatically and in some places are even tending to disappear. Forest Management Units (FMU) 08005, 08006 and 08008 as well as the Mpem and Djim National Park, the target area of the project, illustrate this. To address this issue, this pre-project, which aims to contribute to the sustainable management of forest ecosystems through the valorization of ecosystemic services, will establish priority sites based on different layers to guide the lines of intervention and provide a robust database for the preparation and implementation of the actual project.

2.4 Relevant Experience of EA	<p>ADEID is a Cameroonian non-governmental organization (NGO) established in 1990 with the mission to promote low-carbon, equitable, inclusive and sustainable development. Its work involves the greening and digitalization of value chains in different sectors of the national economy. Its most salient experiences are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Project for the conservation of sacred forests and raffia palm groves at high altitudes in West Cameroon * Project for the conservation of Mont Nlonako and endemic species
3.1 Conformity with ITTO objectives (ITTA, 2006) and priorities (current SAP)	<p>The project proposal associated with this pre-project aims to promote activities for the reduction of deforestation and forest degradation, and the promotion of ecosystemic services. These results will be achieved through enrichment, reforestation and agroforestry in and around the Mpem and Djim National Park, with a view to combating poverty. The above objective is consistent with ITTO's objectives in the following paragraphs set out in the first article of the International Tropical Timber Agreement, 2006, namely: c, j and r, which state:</p> <p>c) "Contributing to sustainable development and to poverty alleviation: the project will support the self-development efforts of local communities through the sustainable use of natural resources". As a result, at least 22 local community groups will experience a reduction in the poverty threshold</p> <p>j) "Encouraging members to support and develop tropical timber reforestation, as well as rehabilitation and restoration of degraded forest land, with due regard for the interests of local communities dependent on their forest resources". The project will encourage reforestation of degraded land in particular. A participatory approach will be adopted to encourage the involvement of local people and consideration of their rights and interests.</p> <p>r) "Encouraging members to recognize the role of forest-dependent indigenous and local communities in achieving sustainable forest management and develop strategies to enhance the capacity of these communities to sustainably manage tropical timber producing forests". The project will promote demonstration activities for the benefit of local communities. Emphasis will be placed on the involvement of local and indigenous communities, so that their needs and interests are taken into account.</p>
3.2 Relevance to the ITTO Programme Lines	<p>The project to be developed is consistent with Strategic Priority 4 set out in the ITTO Strategic Action Plan 2013-2018, namely: "Reduce tropical deforestation and forest degradation and enhance the provision of environmental services". At project completion, the problem of deforestation and degradation will be resolved in the forest plots through the various types of enrichment and the involvement of local communities.</p>
3.3 Relevance to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the Global Forest Goals (GFGs) and other forest related global agenda	<p>The above objective complies with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 13 and 15, which state as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - SDG 13: "Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts". <p>In accordance with the baseline scenario established by the pre-project, the project will highlight additionality and the contribution made to combating climate change".</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - SDG 15: "Protect, restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification, and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss". <p>The project proposal will address the problems of reforestation and carbon sequestration through forest plantations and natural regeneration. Approximately 200 000 hectares of land will be restored. The sequestered carbon will eventually provide ecological and economic added value.</p> <p>The project will also be linked to three Global Forest Goals (GFG). These are GFG 1, GFG 2 and GFG 3.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - GFG 1: Reverse the loss of forest cover. <p>The valorization of ecosystemic services will allow for better community involvement in the sustainable management of forest ecosystems and the preservation of biodiversity.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - GFG 2: Enhance forest-based benefits and livelihoods. <p>The development of value chains for timber and non-timber products and the promotion of agroforestry will improve the incomes of municipalities and local communities. Approximately 1 864 households in 22 villages will see their incomes increase significantly as a result of these new Income-Generating Activities.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - GFG 3: Protect forests and use sustainable forest products. <p>The project will allow for the extension and promotion of Low-Impact Logging standards and techniques.</p>

3.4 Relevance to submitting country policies	The project is in line with the National Development Strategy (SND30) through its point 3.1.4 dealing with forest-timber aspects and point 3.6.1 dealing with the sustainable management of natural resources. One of the growth drivers tackled is silviculture. This driver is in line with the National Forest Plantation Development Strategy, the National Determined Contribution (NDC), the national REDD+ strategy and the national forest investment framework.

4.1 Objectives (reflecting reference to elements within all ITTO Guidelines as applicable)	<p>Development objective: To contribute to the sustainable management of forest ecosystems through the valorization of ecosystemic services.</p> <p>Specific objective: To develop a project proposal to support natural regeneration and forest plantations with high-value-added species for the valorization of environmental services in and around the Mpem and Djim National Park.</p>
4.2 Key problem(s) to be addressed	<p>The Mbam and Kim Department is characterized by the presence of three Forest Management Units comprising FMU 08005, FMU 08006 and FMU 08008, and a protected area (Mpem and Djim National Park). These FMUs, formerly used for timber production, have been abandoned by their operators because of their significant degradation and the high proportion of area under savanna. The only areas of resilient forests are gallery forests that are subjected to intense illegal logging. Local people and transhumance herds encroach on these FMUs and the National Park. After they were abandoned, these FMUs were transferred to the National School of Water and Forests (ENEF) and the National Forestry Development Agency (ANAFOR).</p> <p>This pre-project intends to provide information about priority sites, highlighting the importance of the problem of deforestation and degradation and identifying the main stakeholders and the most popular timber species and non-timber forest products (NTFPs). In addition, the training needs of local populations will be identified in terms of the valorization of forest resources and payment for ecosystemic services with a view to contributing to the implementation of the national REDD+ strategy and the national forest plantation development strategy.</p> <p>The development of the project proposal is subject to a number of constraints: the virtually non-existent or very approximate silvicultural and dendrometric data, the lack of information about the main stakeholders. In addition, there is a lack of awareness of opportunities offered by the REDD+ and REDDES in the project area. The resources required for the preliminary studies are also lacking.</p>
