ANNOTATIONS TO THE PROVISIONAL AGENDA

Item 1 - Opening of the Session

The Fifty-fifth Sessions of the Committees will be conducted jointly and chaired by Mr. Zahrul Muttaquin (Indonesia), Chairperson of the Committee on Forest Industry (CFI) and the Chairperson of the Committee on Economics, Statistics and Markets (CEM - to be confirmed).

Item 2 - Adoption of Agenda and Organization of Work

The Committees may consider the Provisional Agenda and adopt the Agenda for their sessions. On the organization of work, it is to be noted that the schedule of meetings for the work of the Committees will be determined after usual consultations. The Committees may also constitute the usual informal openended working group(s) to assist in the consideration of specific matters related to the Agenda. Due to the ongoing consultations with the Informal Advisory Group regarding logistics of convening the Fifty-seventh ITTC Session virtually, additional communications regarding how/whether items on the Committees' agenda will be handled will be communicated to members as relevant decisions are taken and/or at the start of the virtual session.

Item 3 - Admission of Observers

The Committees may admit those observers as approved by the Council to attend the sessions as observers.

Item 4 - ITTO Annual Market Discussion - 2021

The theme of the virtual ITTO Annual Market Discussion - 2021 as proposed by the Trade Advisory Group (T-A-G) is "Challenges in the COVID-19 pandemic". The Market Discussion will be convened under the Council (rather than under a session of the Joint Committees) as an extraordinary measure during the virtual ITTC 57 session. Item 8 - Report on Completed Projects and Pre-projects

The Committees may recall that the below project was declared complete at its Fifty-fourth Session in November 2020, with the financial account still containing an unspent balance of US\$61,045. The Secretariat agreed to the use of these funds for implementing the "Additional Technical Functionalities of the National Forest Stocks Monitoring System (NFSMS)". This work is scheduled to be completed by September 2021. Due to the significant delays already experienced in completing this project (which commenced implementation nearly a decade ago), it was agreed with the Executing Agency (EA) and ITTO's auditors that if a satisfactory report on the use of the additional funds along with a detailed financial statement was not submitted to the Secretariat prior to ITTC 57, the agreement for the EA to use the remaining funds would be terminated and a refund would be requested. The Secretariat and/or the representative of the Philippines will provide a report to the Committee during this session.

A list showing projects declared complete by both Committees from 2017-21 (indicating in bold any meeting the criteria of Decision 3(XXVIII) of ITTO budget over US\$400,000) is included below. The table also includes relevant thematic program projects declared complete by Council. When considering projects for possible ex-post evaluation, the Committees should note that funds in the pooled ex-post evaluation fund established under Decision 3(XXVIII) currently total US\$57,930.26 /US\$15,000 for CEM/CFI. The Committees should also note that travel to most project locations remains difficult or impossible.

Extract from Decision 3(XXVIII) Annex I, Paragraph 1(iii): Procedures to Identify Projects/Groups of Projects for Ex-Post Evaluation

To assess if a project requires ex-post evaluation, the Committee(s) should take into account the nature of the project (ex-post evaluation is particularly important for human resources and institutional/infrastructure development projects). A short-list of projects whose ex-post evaluations would be beneficial should be prepared by selecting those meeting the following requirements:

(a) ITTO budget of individual projects or groups of projects above an appropriate level(e.g. US\$400,000);

- (b) Clear benefits to be derived from learning more about facts, achievements and difficulties during project implementation and completion, including information and data on:
 - whether the expected outputs were achieved;
 - whether the project achieved its specific objective(s);
 - whether there were unexpected results and impacts, either harmful or beneficial;
 - who benefited from the project;
 - what were the key lessons learned from the project;
 - what direct recommendations have arisen for future projects; and
 - whether the project activities are sustainable.
- (c) The potential for wider application of lessons learned;
- (d) Other factors as considered appropriate by the Committees.

Item 10 - Policy Work

ITTC policy work instructions to Committees, pursuant to ITTC Decision 4(XXV) include:

- Restructure the agendas of the Committees to include a separate agenda item for policy work.
- Use the current ITTO Strategic Action Plan, the policy-relevant aspects of the ITTO Biennial Work
 Programmes, the findings of completed projects and Council Decisions as the primary basis for
 identifying items for policy development.
- Decide during each session of each Committee those subjects which will be discussed under the agenda item Policy Work during its next session and agree upon the way to prepare for such a discussion in the Committee.

Committee on Economics, Statistics and Markets

The Committees at their Fifty-fourth Session held discussions and agreed to continue to work in the Fifty-fifth Session on the following policy-related matters under the Committee on Economics, Statistics and Markets:

- Market Access;
- Forest and Timber Certification;
- APEC EGILAT and ITTO collaboration; and
- IMM Progress Report.

A Secretariat presentation on market access and certification issues as well a presentation from the lead consultant on IMM progress will be circulated prior to the virtual session; an IMM progress report will also be contained in document ITTC(LVII)/10. ITTO participated at and presented an update of its work at the 18th APEC-EGILAT meeting in February 2021, convened virtually and hosted by New Zealand. ITTO further participated at and contributed to the APEC-EGILAT 3rd Policy Theme Workshop 'Advancing the Trade and Distribution of Legally Harvested Forest Products'' at the end of May 2021. ITTO will continue to proactively engage with APEC-EGILAT at its future meetings in 2022 (to be hosted by Thailand) and beyond.

• Enhancing conservation and sustainable management of teak forests in Greater Mekong Sub-region.
