ITTO side-event Enriching Biodiversity in Tropical Production Landscapes through SFM

The 15th Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) in December 2022 agreed on a new global biodiversity framework with four goals and 23 targets to be achieved by 2030, including target 10 which focuses on sustainable forestry. Forests are crucial habitats for 80% of the world's terrestrial biodiversity. The UN has established the Strategic Plan for Forests 2017–2030 and the Decade for Ecosystem Restoration 2021–2030 to promote inclusive and integrated approaches to ecosystem restoration and sustainable forest management (SFM).

The Joint ITTO–CBD Collaborative Initiative for Tropical Forest Biodiversity, established in 2011, has worked to

enhance biodiversity conservation in tropical forests and address deforestation and forest degradation through local stakeholder engagement. This collaboration was renewed until 2025 to support CBD Parties and ITTO member countries in their efforts towards biodiversity conservation, SFM, and sustainable use of forest resources.

This side-event will showcase forest biodiversity targets in the Kunming–Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, highlight lessons from the ITTO–CBD Collaborative Initiative, and share best practices for integrating biodiversity conservation and SFM in the Greater Mekong Subregion and the Amazon to promote healthy and productive forest landscapes.
