
GLOBAL TEAK RESOURCES & MARKET ASSESSMENT 2023

TEAKNET, IUFRO and FAO are joining together for a Global Teak Resources & Market assessment 2023 just initiated to be completed by December 2023.

The previous global teak resource assessment was done by FAO and published as FAO Report in 2012.

The study would focus on a detailed assessment of the world's teak resources, its distribution at country, regional and global levels, ownership status of the plantations, productivity aspects, trade and major markets and the ways in which these teak sectors have changed over the years.

The report of the study will be published as an IUFRO publication.


