INTRODUCTION

Forest Landscape Restoration (FLR) has gained global support over the years. FLR is the ongoing process of regaining ecological functionality and enhancing human well-being across deforested and degraded forest landscapes. It goes beyond just planting trees it is restoring a whole landscape to meet present and future needs and to offer multiple benefits and land use over time.

FLR is a vehicle for delivering on internationally agreed commitments on forests, biodiversity, climate change and desertification. Among other things, it contributes to Sustainable Development Goal 1 (No Poverty), 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation) and 15 (Life on Land).

Meanwhile, in cooperation with international organizations, the International Timber Organization Tropical (ITTO) encourages FLR and the development of plantations that achieve positive economic, social and environmental outcomes. To this end, ITTO has published guidelines and a manual related to FLR for example, ITTO Guidelines for Restoration, Management Rehabilitation of Degraded and Secondary Tropical Forest, 2002 and revised and updated in 2020; Restoring Forest Landscapes: An Introduction to the Art and Science of FLR explore and explain the concepts and strategies involved in FLR 2005; Guidelines for FLR in the Tropics Policy Brief (2020).
