

Group 1: BWP Field oriented activities with engagement of/work in member countries

Activity 1: Building legal and sustainable forest product supply chains

Implementation Approach:

Support development of innovative solutions to providing assurances of legality and sustainability, including developing/implementing sustainable forest management plans and developing/implementing sustainable supply chains including timber tracking systems and other tools. Under the 2018-20 BWP, ITTO developed a programme on legal and sustainable supply chains (LSSC) for tropical wood and forest products and worked with relevant partners to increase assurance of legality and sustainability through the establishment of a supply chain platform that links legal and sustainable forest products to markets. Under the BWP for 2021-2022 extended into 2023, two sub-activities under this Activity were approved and fully funded by the Commerce and Investment Promotion Institute (IPIM) of Macao SAR, China, namely "Supporting the Establishment and Operation of the Global Timber Index Platform for Building Legal and Sustainable Forest Products Supply Chains" (GTI Phase I) and "Supporting Pilot Collaborative Operation of the Blockchain-based Timber Traceability System for Building Legal and Sustainable Forest Products Supply Chains" (BTTS Phase I). Under the BWP for 2024-2025, two sub-activities of GTI, namely "Consolidating and Improving the Global Timber Index (GTI) Platform to provide Multi-dimensional Service for the Legal and Sustainable Timber Supply Chains" (GTI Phase II) and "Enhancing and Improving the Global Timber Index (GTI) Platform for Promoting the Legal and Sustainable Timber Supply Chains" (GTI Phase III), and two sub-activities of BTTS, namely "Establishing and Testing a Simulation Platform for Cross-border Timber Traceability Based on the Blockchain Technology for Building Legal and Sustainable Timber Supply Chains" (BTTS Phase II) and "Upgrading the Platform of Blockchain-based Timber Traceability System, and Conducting Application Tests in Practical Operation Scenarios of Legal and Sustainable Timber Traceability" (BTTS Phase III), were approved and fully funded by the IPIM respectively. Using remaining funds under the BWP for 2024-2025 and expected funding sources from voluntary contributions, the work will continue into 2026-2027, including building the LSSC-GGSC platform, upgrading and enhancing the functions of the GTI Platform and developing a trading platform based on the BTTS to facilitate and promote legal and sustainable timber trade, as well as other events and activities.

ACTIVITY 1: Terms of Reference

I. Background

This activity will involve close collaboration with donors seeking to ensure legality of tropical timber imports. The activity will build on previous work by ITTO and partners to promote SFM and to establish sustainable supply chains, including through innovative timber tracking systems.

II. Description

The activity will support key exporters to respond to emerging demands from consumers for the development of green supply chains. In 2026-2027 work will be continued on the implementation of the programme on legal and sustainable supply chains (LSSC) for tropical wood and forest products. Activities and sub-activities will involve building the LSSC-GGSC platform; upgrading and enhancing the functions of the GTI Platform (GTI Phase IV&V) and developing a trading platform based on the BTTS to facilitate and promote legal and sustainable timber trade (BTTS Phase IV&V); as well as other events and activities. ITTO will recruit an experienced team to implement this activity.

III. Expected outputs

The activity will result in tropical forest concessionaires developing increased capacity for SFM and/or sustainable supply chains together with the main private sector importers in key consumer countries. It will thereby increase trade in sustainable/legally verified timber. The activity will facilitate the construction of LSSC-GGSC platform including upgrading and enhancing the functions of the GTI Platform (GTI Phase IV&V) and developing a trading platform based on the BTTS to facilitate and promote legal and sustainable timber trade (BTTS Phase IV&V), as well as other events and activities. Using remaining funds under the BWP for 2024-2025 and expected funding sources from voluntary contributions, the following work will continue into 2026-2027, including building the LSSC-GGSC platform, upgrading and enhancing the functions of the GTI Platform and developing a trading platform based on the BTTS to facilitate and promote legal and sustainable timber trade, as well as other events and activities.


