  - Hardwoods and Softwoods
  - Plywood, lumber, flooring, decking, moulding

- Active throughout the world
  - Not one sourcing location.
  - Flexible business models

  - From overseas to N. America
  - From N. America to overseas

# Legality is Key

- Elements of the marketplace are demanding more assurances of legality.
- Illegal logging is defined to mean timber that is harvested, transported, processed or sold in contravention of a country's laws.
  - Illegal trade not identified as main factor in recent eNGO initiatives focus on "associated trade"

# Legal Trade Happens

- What establishes legal trade and legal compliance with laws?
- Countries control imports and exports
- This is done through a system of declarations

## Export Compliance

Assign classifications to what is exported

Check documentation

Must satisfy domestic and foreign regulations prior to being allowed to board vessel.

## Import Compliance

- Invoices / Bills of Lading
- Appropriate declarations (volume/value)
- Country of origin
- Agriculture Permits / Certifications
- Duties and Fees are assigned and paid
- All occurs under the watchful eyes of government inspectors

#### So why the need?

- Address industry legal assurance needs.
  - Small, family-owned businesses
  - Lack of leverage, ability to influence
  - Lack of resources, due diligence only to a point
  - Predictability key to expanding business in country.
- It is not meant to substitute or replace legal framework in sovereign countries

## What is illegal?

- No uniform definition, range of actions
  - Each country working on eliminating illegality
  - Labor, Land Tenure, Conflicting/Confusing Laws and Regulations, Unintentional/Intentional, Smuggling, Fraud, Bribery, Counterfeiting
- Most suspicious volume does not enter the international supply chain
  - □ 2 to 4 per cent?
  - □ 23 to 30 percent?

#### Phased Approaches - What importers need?

- Simple and consistent rules
- Flexible Time Frame
- Affordable

# Keep it Simple

- Use ITTO benchmarks
- Don't change the rules
- Make sure it translates country to country

#### Flexible Timeframe

Certification is a voluntary, market based tool.

 As such, companies should be able to choose the level of certification that works best for them and STAY at that level.

- No price premiums for certified wood products in the United States
- Certification does not translate into a larger market share.
- Certification has to be sustainable environmentally and financially.

#### The debate ahead

Simple, transparent rules that don't change

- No "end goal" requirement
- Cost efficient

Multiple partner opportunities – competition is good in industry and among "certifiers"
