#### PREFACE

Bamboo Plantation Establishment, Bamboo Forest Management and Bamboo Products Production Training Course, Training No. (2) was organized by the Project; Promoting Sustainable Utilization of Bamboo through Community Participation in Sustainable Forest Management [PD 146/02 Rev.1 (I)] with the support of International Tropical Timber Organization (ITTO). Forest Research Institute (FRI) Yezin supported the training.

The objectives of the training course were to acquaint the trainees with theory and practice in the form of on the job training on making of bamboo value-added products, thereby promoting their income and transferring their experiences to their peers. It is hoped that this kind of training will help to promote understanding of sustainable management of bamboo forests, which can lead to the future forest conservation of the country.

The training course was conducted at Moswe, Yamethin Forest District, Mandalay Division, during 5-16 November 2004. There were 18 participants and most of them have some experience in the production of local bamboo handicrafts and weaving. The participants composed of Forest Rangers from the Forest Department and local communities from the 3 project sites in Pyinmana, Paukkaung and Kawhmu Townships.

In order to supervise the training, a training course committee was formed on the 18th of October, 2004. Chairman and co-chairman of the committee were U Saw Eh Dah, Coordinator of the project PD 146/02 Rev.1 (I) and U Htun Paw Oo, National Project Director of the ITTO Bamboo Project. Members of the committee were Dr. San Win and Daw Khin May Lwin, Deputy Project Managers of the project and the secretary of the committee was U Khin Maung Oo, Deputy Project Manager of the Project. Other project staffs included for facilitating the training were U Aung Soe, U Tint Khaing, U San Oo and Daw Khaing Khaing Tun of the Forest Research Institute (Yezin).

The opening ceremony was carried out at the FRI, Yezin and it was presided by U Htun Paw Oo, Director of the Forest Research Institute (FRI), Forest Department, Ministry of Forestry.

It was found that all the 18 trainees passed the evaluation standard after 12- days of intensive training. The criteria for the evaluation included standard test table, interest and outcomes of their practical works.

Certification of participation on the Training course on bamboo plantation establishment, bamboo forest management and bamboo products production was given to the participants after the completion of the training course.

#### **Training Procedure**

#### Curriculum

The training course consists of lectures, practical works and study tour. The practical works were divided into 3 sessions; Session I Charcoal kiln making session, Session II Establishment of bamboo plantation and Session III Natural bamboo forest management. After completing the course at each session, the groups were rotated so that each and every group got the chance to attend all the sessions. The training period for each session was 4 days so that after 12 days, all the trainees completed all the 3 sessions included in the training course.

The contents of the training course included Bamboo propagation and plantation establishment, Systematic exploitation of bamboo, Bamboo charcoal kiln making, Bamboo sieve and tray making, Bamboo handicrafts making and Bamboo hat making. The latter three were mainly practical trainings on easy to make bamboo products.

### Bamboo Charcoal Kiln Making

The curriculum covers charcoal kiln construction, species selection for burning charcoal, preparation for charcoal burning and demonstration of charcoal burning. Daw Khin May Lwin, Deputy National Project Manager; Head of Bamboo Processing Section conducted the training. The training period was 2 days.

### Establishment of bamboo plantations

The curriculum covers selection of planting materials, methods of propagation and plantation establishment. Dr. San Win, Deputy National Project Manger, Head of Bamboo Management Section, ITTO Bamboo Project conducted the training. The training period was one day.

## Natural bamboo forest management and community development

The curriculum for training covers management and silvicultural practices in natural bamboo forests and community development. The training was conducted by U Mehm Ko Ko Gyi , National Consultant (Forest Management) of the project and Dr. San Win, Deputy National Project Manger, Head of Bamboo Management Section .


#### 15:00 Course Evaluation

### Suggestions

Bamboo Plantation Establishment, Bamboo Forest Management and Bamboo Products Production Training Course, Training No.2 is the second programme to transfer knowledge and experience concerning development of bamboo products industries domestically and aboard to general villagers. The training course aims at efficient utilization of natural bamboo resource through encouraging the production of marketable value-added bamboo charcoal by the local communities. The trainees may have enough skill to produce bamboo charcoal to meet the market demand and earn more income for their families. It is also expected that the trainees will share their experiences to their peers for the benefit of their villages. It is suggested that:

- 1. Training on bamboo plantation establishment and management, should be encouraged.
- 2. Bamboo products production group should be established.
- 3. More training equipments should be supported.
- 4. There should be more intensive monitoring and evaluation so as to assess the benefits of the training to each trainee.
- 5. Study tour to bamboo plantations is necessary so as to arouse the interest of the local communities.
