Training on Agroforestry and Income Generation for Local Community Completion Report



September, 2018

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1. Introduction

By the collaboration between Forest Department, Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation of Myanmar and International Tropical Timber Organization (ITTO), a new project is currently implementing entitled "**Capacity Building for Strengthening Transboundary Biodiversity Conservation of the Tanintharyi Range in Myanmar (Phase I – Stage I) (PD 723/13 REV.2 (F))**". Capacity building and awareness raising of both local staff and local community involved as the main activities of the project. Therefore, capacity building trainings for relevant stakeholders, education talks and extension programmes for awareness raising and active participation of the local communities in the sector of Biodiversity conservation will be conducted throughout the duration of the project. With the objective of fulfilling the targeted activities of the project, a training has been organized to support the livelihood of local communities; different agroforestry methods and income generation opportunities were the main subjects for this training.

2. Objectives of the training

This training was organized with the following objectives;

- 1) To share the knowledge on the concept of transboundary biodiversity conservation, climate change, proximate and underlying causes of habitat losses and ecosystem deterioration;
- 2) To understand the livelihoods and income generation activities that are less dependent on the forest resources in order to support habitat restoration and biodiversity conservation; and
- 3) To understand the different agroforestry techniques; those play an important role to improve local livelihoods.

3. Duration of the training

The duration of the training last for three days starting from 9th September through 11th September 2018.

4. Level of the trainees

Local communities residing in the villages within the Tanintharyi Township, Myeik Township and Botepyin Township of the Tanintharyi Region were invited to attend at the training.

9. Schedule of the training

10.Type of the training

Trainers applied participatory approach for lecturing by making all participants actively participated and enjoyed the training. During the lecture, different teaching methods such as role playing, group discussions, games and presentations of the trainees were involved.

11.Logistic arrangements

- a) Lecture notes for different subjects were prepared by each respective lecturer and managed to distribute by the financial support of the project.
- **b**) Other logistic arrangements such as venue of the training, preparation for the training, accommodation and travels of both trainers and trainees were organized by the project secretariat in collaboration with the local forest department.
- c) Local Forest Department which is Tanintharyi Township Forest Department supported other logistic matters such as invitation of the trainees, meals, accommodation, etc.

12.Closing session of the training

The closing session of the training was held at the training venue which is Forest camp located at Chaung Naut Pyan Village, Tanintharyi Township at 3:00 PM on 11th September 2018. U Ba Khin, Deputy Director of Forest Research Institute gave the training certificates to all the trainees and mentioned his thanks for their active participations throughout the training.

13.Reviews on the training

- a) Trainees were actively participated throughout the training. They were found showing respects and interests on the lectures of the trainers.
- b) Apart from the lecture time, group discussions were also involved to seek the traditional knowledge of local communities regarding the farming practices, utilization and processing non-timber forest products. Through those activities, we could have identified the traditional systems of agroforestry, utilization pattern of NTFP and their markets so that it will be beneficial for future preparation of community-based natural resource management plan.
- c) Some trainees suggested to extend the duration of the training and to be involved the field practice as part of the training curriculum.

14.Outputs of the training

By this training, the following outputs have been achieved;

- a) Traditional agroforestry pattern of the villages in Tanintharyi Township including the species composition, horizontal and vertical structure, crop products and crop calendar;
- b) The existing knowledge of local community could have been enhanced by sharing systematic agroforestry techniques, that they can apply to upgrade their current home gardens and agroforestry systems;

c) Income generation activities other than traditional farming practices such as producing value-added products from Non-timber Forest Products (NTFPs), SMART patrolling in collaboration with local NGOs and INGOs, cultivation of medicinal plants, livestock rearing, etc., have been shared with the local people to enlighten their mindset.

15.Conclusion

By organizing agroforestry techniques and income-generation training, we could have enhanced the experience and knowledge of the local communities in terms of potential for compiling advanced and systematic techniques to their traditional ways. By this mean, the local communities got insights and knowledge to improve their livelihood options. As the economy of Myanmar is based on natural resources and major livelihoods of local communities are farming and production of forest products, this kind of training is critically important for local people not only to support community based natural resources management but also to ensure livelihood security of the local community.
