

### **BACKGROUND OF THE PROJECT**

- The project was approved and financed in November 2012 at the 48<sup>th</sup> ITTC meeting in Yokohama, Japan. This project was financed by the governments of Japan and Republic of Korea through ITTO.
- The total budget was US\$ 555,527, which included US \$ 464,033 of ITTO contribution and US\$ 91,494 of the Executive Agency in kind contribution.
- The project agreement was signed by the Royal Government of Cambodia and ITTO in January 2013.
- The project was initially planned for 36 months (May 2013-April 2016), a three-months extension (up to July 2016) without additional funding in order to complete execution of the project activities.

× OUTPUT 2: No less than 576 community leaders and members were involved in the different training on techniques relating to livelihood improvement and at least 608 community leaders and members have had their awareness on FLEG and SFM significantly improved.

**× Output 3:** Improved public awareness on FLEG and SFM through wide distribution of thousands of brochure, posters, calendars, comic book etc., enhanced operational capacity of FA in forestry extension operations through implementation of a sound forestry extension program by 58 FA newly trained as extension officers.
