

Selected U.S. Market Indicators


- Relatively strong U.S. GDP growth has lead to strong U.S. dollar

U.S. Dollar Rise Against Global Currencies


NYBOT US DOLLAR INDEX




Interest Rates Remain Near 0%




New Housing Starts Rebound, Though Well Below Pre-Recession Highs

Priorities:


- Train employees who may be new to Lacey compliance

TPP Environmental Chapter-Objectives

- promote mutually supportive trade and environmental policies
- promote high levels of environmental protection and effective enforcement of environmental laws; and
- enhance the capacities of the Parties to address trade-related environmental issues, including through cooperation.
- recognize that enhanced cooperation to protect and conserve the environment and sustainably manage their natural resources brings benefits that can
 - contribute to sustainable development,
 - strengthen their environmental governance,
 - and complement the objectives of the TPP Agreement.
- recognize that it is inappropriate to establish or use their environmental laws or other measures in a manner which would constitute a disguised restriction on trade or investment between Parties.
