Background

Guaranteeing the legal origin of timber and timber products remains one of the main challenges for both producer and consumer countries. As deforestation and forest degradation in tropical countries persists, greater scrutiny is exercised at international trade of timber and timber products, including verifications systems to ensure legality.

As a response to this scenario, Guatemala provides an interesting experience, putting in place an innovative information system that allows verification for harvesting, transportation and processing of timber, reducing administrative processes for the forest producers, and offering a traceability system of its legal origin for consumers and for the Forest Service.

The International Timber Trade Organization (ITTO) and the National Forest Institute of Guatemala (INAB) jointly host a side event at the XIV World Forestry Congress to present achievements, lessons learnt and challenges of this initiative. This side event provides an excellent opportunity to obtain practical evidence and explore feasibility of replication in countries with similar challenges.
